Appendix C | Rural Centers Identification Guide

Strong Gateway Presence

A community's entrance could be considered a gateway if it effectively marks a transition from the countryside into the Rural Center, especially along a major route. The gateway can reflect the community's identity, create an aesthetically pleasing effect, calm traffic, and produce other benefits. A subtle form may simply be a change in the landscape from farmland or woodland to residences and businesses (as shown in the upper image), whereas a stronger gateway likely incorporates substantial signage, landscaping, or other elements.




